

EXPLANATIONS

on the application for national approval of recognition as an aeromedical examiner (AME) of another member state

The aeromedical examiner approved in one EASA Member State may also perform his activities also in another EASA Member State under the following conditions:

- 1. the aeromedical examiner must hold a valid AME certificate issued in an EASA member state:
- 2. right to practice independently as a physician;
- 3. briefing by the Member State that received the application (training at the competent authority, audit at the location of the planned aeromedical practice);
- 4. the aeromedical examiner must meet the national professional requirements for the exercise of the medical profession.

FEES
